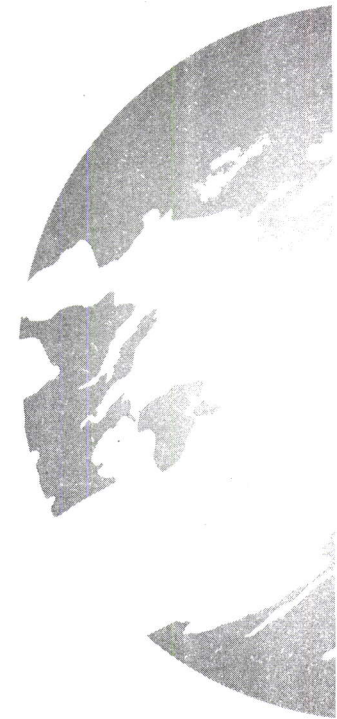

- ⌋ **Poster Presentation Sessions** where there will be the opportunity to view and discuss the posters and resources. Presenters will be allocated time to introduce the key points from their poster or resource. You are invited to submit abstracts for consideration
- ⌋ **Workshops** are designed to offer a forum for discussion and an opportunity to learn more about a wide variety of topics including; formative assessment, self assessment, computers in medical education, patient/doctor communication, clinical problem solving and international student exchange programmes.
